MAST advises jetty will be demolished

Key information is:

- The jetty has been examined and found to have reached the end of its design life
- The jetty is to be closed to pedestrian and boat traffic in November 2004 and demolished
- MAST advises it cannot (alone) fund replacement from its funds (boating registrations)
- MAST suggests replacement may be funded jointly by Clarence City Council and MAST, perhaps with community input.

Recreational Boating Fund applications are available from MAST and need to be lodged by 31 July 2004.

In short, the jetty will no longer be a part of Opossum Bay's tradition and amenity unless you act now, before funds are committed elsewhere.
