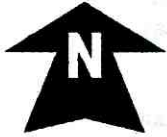

NEW JETTY FOR SUMMER!

Plans for the Opossum Bay jetty have been approved with construction expected to start soon.

The plan shown left is a basic view taken from the scale drawings done for MAST by Thompson Brett Consulting Engineers. The full drawings are on view at the South Arm RSL & Community Club and at the South Arm and Opossum Bay Shops.

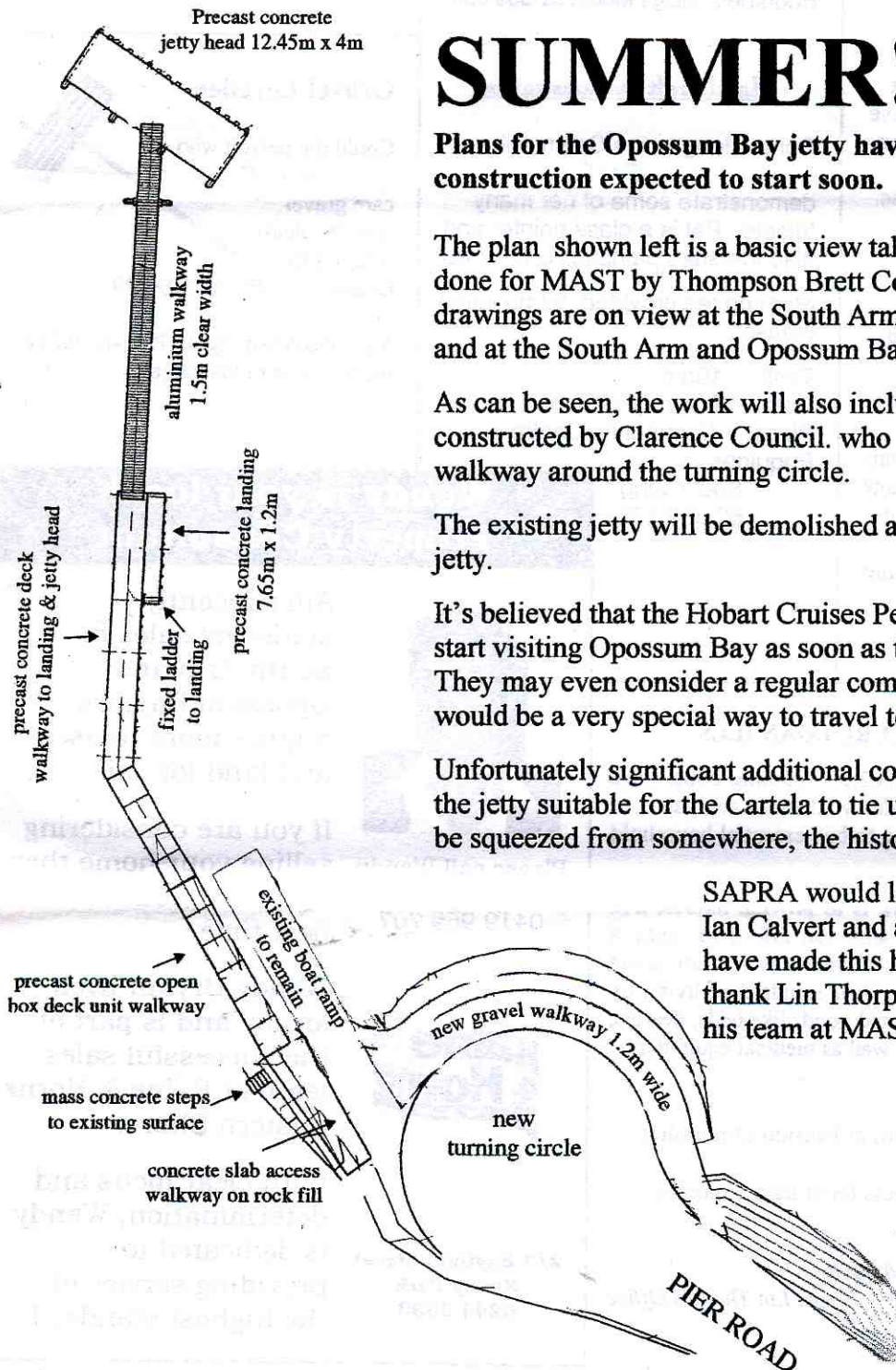
As can be seen, the work will also include a new turning circle to be constructed by Clarence Council, who are also building the new walkway around the turning circle.

The existing jetty will be demolished after construction of the new jetty.

It's believed that the Hobart Cruises Peppermint Bay ferries will start visiting Opossum Bay as soon as the new jetty is operational. They may even consider a regular commuter service – now that would be a very special way to travel to work in the city!

Unfortunately significant additional construction is required to make the jetty suitable for the Cartela to tie up so unless further funds can be squeezed from somewhere, the historic ferry won't be calling in.
